## Boerne Performing Arts Lesson Plan -- Time for Three Target Grade - 5th Grade

**Objective:** Students will learn about a variety of styles and genres of modern musical trio. Students will prepare to attend the Boerne Performing Arts performance.

## **TEKS Addressed:**

**Historical and Cultural Relevance** -- Students will be expected to identify and describe music from diverse genres, styles, periods, and cultures.

**Critical Evaluation and Response** -- Students will be expected to exhibit audience etiquette during live and recorded performances; evaluate a variety of compositions, and formal or informal musical performances using specific criteria; and justify personal preferences for specific music works and styles using music vocabulary.

## Lesson Plan:

- 1. Focus/Hook: Let's talk about the string family of the orchestra. Students discuss what makes an instrument a string instrument, names of the instruments (violin, viola, cello, bass, banjo, guitar, ukulele, etc.), and what makes each instrument higher/lower and unique.
- On December 7th, all 5th grade students in Boerne ISD will attend a special Boerne Performing Arts performance featuring 2 violins and double bass along with unique vocals and singing.

- 3. Watch promo video of Time for Three: VIDEO
- 4. Discuss audience manners, expectations on and off the bus, expectations as students enter and exit CHS, expectations of dealing with BPA members and other teachers.
- 5. - 6. Explore other various musical clips on the Artist's Website (<u>Time For Three website</u>) and try to categorize the various genres featured in their performances. Discuss differences in the musical artists and various styles.
- 7. Upon return from performance, students should be ready to discuss:
  - \*Favorite Musical Piece
  - \*Favorite Style or Highlighted Artist
  - \*Recommendation to next year's 5th grade
